In common language, "hate speech" refers to offensive discourse targeting a group or an individual based on inherent characteristics (such as race, religion or

Hate speech is "any kind of communication in speech, writing or behavior that attacks or uses pejorative or discriminatory language with reference to a person or a group on the basis of who they are, in other words, based on their religion, ethnicity, nationality, race, colour, descent, gender or other identity factors."

It is often employed in the promulgation of conspiracy theories, disinformation and denial and distortion of historical events such as genocide. Countries all over the world are required to prohibit the most severe forms of hate speech that constitute incitement to violence, hostility or discrimination, or incitement to genocide or other violations of international law.

In joining the force to prohibit hate speech and xenophobia, Cameroon's Minister of Communication, Rene Emmanuel Sadi, the President of the National Commission for the Promotion of Bilingualism and Multiculturalism, Peter Mafany Musonge, and the Minister of Territorial Administrations, Paul Atanga Nji, had declared priority measures whereby such individual threats would be restricted in Cameroon.

A mounting number of attacks on immigrants and other minorities have raised major concerns about the connection between inflammatory speech online and violent acts, as well as the role of corporations and the state in policing speech. Analysts say trends in hate crimes around the world echo changes in the political climate, and that social media can magnify discord. At their most extreme, rumors and invective disseminated online have contributed to violence ranging from lynching to ethnic cleansing.

Violence in "the name of religion" is often manifested through targeted attacks on individuals or communities, acts of extremism or terrorism, communal violence, State repression, discriminative policies or legislation and other types of embedded structural violence. Incidents involving hate speech, negative stereotyping, and advocacy of religious or national hatred have resulted in killings of innocent people, attacks on places of worship and calls for reprisals. Such violence also disproportionately targets religious dissidents, members of religious minorities, converts or nonbelievers.

The response has been uneven, and the task of deciding what to censor, and how, has largely fallen to the handful of corporations that control the platforms on which much of the world now communicates. But these companies are constrained by domestic laws. In liberal democracies, these laws can serve to defuse discrimination and head off violence against minorities. But such laws can also be used to suppress minorities and dissidents.

The Cameroon government has not only read the riot act on the prohibition of hate speech but also discussed the impact of the individual threat on society and emphasised the need for immediate action to combat it during a press conference in the country's capital, Yaounde recently.

In backing the recent measures of the Cameroonian government, social scientists and others have observed how social media posts, and other online speech, had inspired acts of violence:

In Germany a correlation was found between anti-refugee Facebook posts by the far-right Alternative for Germany party and attacks on refugees. Scholars Karsten Muller and Carlo Schwarz observed that upticks in attacks, such as arson and assault, followed spikes in hate-mongering posts.

In the United States, perpetrators of recent white supremacist attacks have circulated among racist communities online, and also embraced social media to publicize their acts. Prosecutors said the Charleston church shooter, who killed nine black clergy and worshippers in June 2015, engaged in a "self-learning process" online that led him to believe that the goal of white supremacy required violent action.



The 2018 Pittsburgh synagogue shooter was a participant in the social media network Gab, whose lax rules have attracted extremists banned by larger platforms. There, he espoused the conspiracy that Jews sought to bring immigrants into the United States, and render whites a minority, before killing eleven worshippers at a refugee-themed Shabbat service. This "great replacement" trope, which was heard at the white supremacist rally in Charlottesville, Virginia, a year prior and originates with the French far right, expresses demographic anxieties about nonwhite immigration and birth rates.

The great replacement trope was in turn espoused by the perpetrator of the 2019 New Zealand mosque shootings who killed forty-nine Muslims at prayer and sought to broadcast the attack on YouTube.

In Myanmar, military leaders and Buddhist nationalists used social



media to slur and demonize the Rohingya Muslim minority ahead of and during a campaign of ethnic cleansing. Though Rohingya comprised perhaps 2 per cent of the population, ethno nationalists claimed that Rohingya would soon supplant the Buddhist majority. The UN fact-finding mission said, "Facebook has been a useful instrument for those seeking to spread hate, in a context where, for most users, Facebook is the Internet."

In India, lynch mobs and other types of communal violence, in many cases originating with rumors on WhatsApp groups, have been on the rise since the Hindu-nationalist Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) came to power in 2014.

Sri Lanka has similarly seen vigilantism inspired by rumors spread online, targeting the Tamil Muslim minority. During a spate of violence in March 2018, the government blocked access to Facebook and WhatsApp, as well as the messaging app Viber, for a week, saying that Facebook had not been sufficiently responsive during the emergency.

In educating its citizens and migrants, Cameroon officials highlighted the importance of freedom of expression and the responsibility that comes with it. Hate speech, they emphasized, is not only harmful to the targeted individuals or groups but also to society as a whole.

Cameroon's Minister of Communication, Rene Emmanuel Sadi said : "From this perspective, it goes without saying that the fight against hate speech must be perceived as an absolute priority towards safeguarding democracy and the Rule of Law, and preserving the values of peace, unity and living



together."

He went on: "That is the reason why the International Community has made it a common cause and is calling for an all-round mobilisation against hate speech on a global scale."

The effects of hate speech

Hate speech not only causes harm at the personal level and can incite violence, it is an attack on inclusion, diversity and human rights. It undermines social cohesion and erodes shared values, setting back peace, stability, sustainable development and the fulfillment of human rights for all.

The West African country also noted that hate speech can take many forms, including verbal and written communication, as well as actions and symbols that promote hatred or discrimination, which they had noticed to have become rampant, especially amongst various tribes and communities in the country.

In the same vein, Peter Mafany Musonge of the bilingualism commission reinvigorated Cameroonians to embrace living together, as prescribed by the Head of state, President Paul Biya.

...Bridaina the divide

In May 2019, the United Nations Strategy and Plan of Action on Hate Speech was launched highlighting that a disturbing groundswell of xenophobia, racism and intolerance is being observed around the world. Social media and other forms of communication are being exploited as platforms for bigotry. Public discourse is being weaponised for political gain with incendiary rhetoric that stigmatises and dehumanises minorities, migrants, refugees, women and any so-called "other".

This is a bigotry act that occurs in all societies, whether offline or online. It can sometimes be hard to assess when a comment is meant as hate speech – especially when expressed in the virtual world. It can also feel overwhelming to try to deal with obviously hateful content.

However, there are many ways you can take a stand, even if you are not personally the victim of hate speech. And you can make a difference.

Pause: Refrain from making any hateful comments yourself and/or relaying such content. Whether online or offline, we should all act responsibly to stop the spread of hate and misinformation. Check out the United Nations #PledgetoPause campaign to find out why it's important to take a moment to pause before you share content online. Learn how to do this responsibly – whether you're forwarding a message, retweeting a story or watching a video in your feed

• Fact-check: In the digital world, it's common to come across misinformation and harmful content, but it's relatively easy to verify content you find is reliable. To detect false and biased information, including hate speech propaganda, be sure to check the content's origin with the help of search engines, fact-checking tools and other reliable sources. You can also download images and run them through image search tools to find out

• Challenge: One way to tackle hate speech is to spread your own counterspeech to make sure hate is not the dominant narrative. You can undermine hateful content with positive messages that spread tolerance, equality and truth in defense of those being targeted by hate.

• Support: Taking a public stand for, and extending solidarity to, people who are the targets of hate speech demonstrates that rejecting hate is the responsibility of every individual.


· Report: Most online platforms and communities have rules to keep user discussions respectful and will let you easily report hate messages to administrators or moderators. Read social media platform guidelines and tips to protect users from harassment and hate speech. For more serious cases – which may constitute incitement to violence, harassment and/or threats prohibited by law notify organisations fighting hate speech and/or file a complaint with police (or the public prosecutor). Some countries have online tools to make reporting hate speech easier.

• Educate: You can help raise awareness of hate speech - online or offline - simply by engaging with your family and friends in conversations about how hateful content can harm societies. Advocate for responsible behaviour and share public campaigns and educational resources.

Minister Sadi on his part outlined several measures that the government intends to take to combat hate speech. These include strengthening existing laws and regulations related to hate speech, increasing public awareness about the harms of hate speech, and promoting positive values such as tolerance and respect.

Taking the floor, Territorial Administration Minister, Paul Atanga Nji, emphasised the importance of holding perpetrators of hate speech accountable for their actions, and announced that the government would be taking legal action against individuals and organisations found to be engaging in hate speech.

Further highlighted by the Francophone country, was the important role that the media can play in combating hate speech. They called on media organisations to promote responsible journalism and to avoid sensationalising stories that could inflame tensions, if not face the consequences as stated in the constitutional law.



Discours haineux et xénophobie des aberrations au Cameroun

e monde tout entier se met ensemble pour combattre certains fléaux dans sa société. Au rang de ses fléaux, nous avons le racisme, la xénophobie et le discours haineux. Ces habitudes qui ne se limitent pas uniquement

à une région, deviennent un défi pour les pays qui n'ont pas pu les combattre sur le plan légal. La République du Cameroun a pris des mesures drastiques en vue de combattre le discours haineux, la xénophobie et le racisme en tant que des aberrations dans le pays.

Selon le langage courant, « discours haineux » fait référence à un discours insultant dirigé contre un groupe ou un

individu sur la base de ses caractéristiques inhérentes (telles que la race, la religion ou le sexe) et cela pourrait mettre la paix sociale en péril. Le discours haineux « correspond à toute forme de discours, de narration ou de comportement s'attaquant à ou utilisant un langage péjoratif ou discriminatoire contre une personne ou un groupe sur la base de qui ils sont, ou encore sur leur religion, ethnicité, nationalité, race, couleur, descendance, sexe ou sur d'autres facteurs identitaires. »

On l'utilise souvent dans la promotion des thèses de complot, de désinformation, de déni et de déformation des événements historiques tels que les génocides. À travers le monde, les pays sont tenus d'interdire les formes les plus graves de discours haineux qui engendrent la violence, l'hostilité, la discrimination ou qui engendrent le génocide ou toutes autres violations de lois internationales.

En associant leurs forces pour combattre le discours haineux et la xénophobie, le Ministre de la communication du Cameroun, Monsieur Emmanuel SADI, le Président de la Commission nationale pour la promotion du bilinguisme et le multiculturalisme, Monsieur Peter Mafany Musonge et le Ministre de l'administration territoriale, Monsieur Paul Atanga Nji, ont pris des mesures prioritaires en vue de restreindre de telles menaces individuelles au Cameroun.

Le nombre accru d'attaques contre les immigrants et d'autres minorités a suscité de vives inquiétudes quant à la relation existant entre l'envolée des discours haineux en ligne et les actes de violence, ainsi que le rôle joué par les entreprises et l'État en matière de contrôle du discours. Selon les

analystes, les tendances de crimes motivés par la haine à travers le monde apportent des changements dans le climat politique et surtout selon eux, les médias sociaux peuvent exacerber la situation. À Îeurs niveaux les plus extrêmes, les rumeurs et les invectives véhiculées en ligne ont engendré de la violence allant du lynchage jusqu'au nettovage ethnique.

La violence « au nom de la religion » se manifeste souvent à travers les attaques ciblées contre les individus ou les communautés, les actes d'extrémisme ou de terrorisme, la violence collective, la répression de l'État, les politiques ou lois discriminatoires et d'autres types de violence structurelle intégrée. Des incidents impliquant les discours haineux, les clichés négatifs et le plaidoyer de la haine religieuse ou nationale ont donné lieu à des tueries de personnes innocentes, aux attaques contre les lieux d'adoration et aux appels aux représailles. De telles violences ciblent également et ce, de manière disproportionnée, les dissidents religieux, les membres de minorités religieuses, les convertis ou les non croyants.

La réponse a été inégale et la responsabilité de décider de ce qui doit être censuré et comment censurer cela a été laissé entre les mains des entreprises qui contrôlent les plateformes sur lesquelles le monde entier communique actuellement. Malheureusement, ces entreprises sont tenues par des lois locales. Dans certaines démocraties libérales, lesdites lois peuvent être à l'origine de la discrimination et de la violence contre les minorités. Par ailleurs, ces lois peuvent être utilisées pour réprimer les minorités et les dissidents.

Lors d'une conférence de presse récemment organisée à Yaoundé, la capitale du pays, le gouvernement camerounais n'a pas seulement lu la loi contre les émeutes en matière d'interdiction du discours haineux, mais a également tenu une discussion relative à l'impact de la menace individuelle sur la société et a mis l'emphase sur la nécessité de prendre des mesures immédiates pour combattre cela.

En soutenant les mesures récentes prises par le gouvernement camerounais, les spécialistes en sciences sociales et d'autres spécialistes ont remarqué que les publications faites sur les réseaux sociaux et d'autres discours haineux



en ligne ont inspiré des actes de violence.

En Allemagne, une corrélation a été établie entre les publications Facebook contre les réfugiés par le parti allemand de l'extrême-droite pour l'alternance et les attaques contre les réfugiés. Les universitaires Karsten Muller et Carlo Schwarz ont remarqué que la montée des attaques, telles que les incendies criminels et les agressions ont été perpétrées suite à l'exacerbation des publications à caractère haineux.

Aux États-Unis, les auteurs des



attaques récentes des suprémacistes blancs ont fait circuler leurs publications parmi les communautés racistes en ligne. Ce qui leur a permis de profiter des réseaux sociaux pour répandre leurs actes. Les Procureurs ont dit que le tireur de l'église de Charleston qui a tué neuf pasteurs et fidèles noirs en 2015, s'était engagé dans un « processus d'auto-apprentissage » en ligne ce qui lui fait croire que l'objectif de la suprématie blanche nécessitait la violence.

Le tireur de la synagogue de Pittsburgh en 2018 était un membre du réseau social Gab dont les règles libérales ont attiré de nombreux extrémistes qui avaient été bannis des plateformes plus grandes. Sur ce réseau social, il a épousé l'idée selon laquelle les juifs avaient pour intention de faire entrer les immigrants aux États-Unis afin de rendre les blancs minoritaires, avant de tuer onze fidèles pendant un culte Shabbat organisé pour les réfugiés. Ce slogan de « Grand changement » que reprenaient les suprémacistes blancs pendant leur manifestation de Charlottesville en Virginie un an auparavant, tire son origine de l'extrême droite française et met en évidence les anxiétés démographiques liées aux taux d'immigration et de naissance des personnes non blanches. Ce slogan de grand changement a

par la suite été récupéré par l'auteur de la fusillade qui a eu lieu à la mosquée de la Nouvelle Zélande en 2019. Fusillade au cours de laquelle l'auteur avait tué guarante-neuf musulmans en train de prier et avait cherché à publier cette attaque sur YouTube.

À Myanmar, les chefs militaires et les nationalistes bouddhistes se servent des médias sociaux pour déprécier et diaboliser la minorité musulmane de Rohingya en prélude à et pendant une campagne de nettoyage ethnique. Bien que la communauté Rohingya ne représente qu'à peu près 2 pour cent de la population, les ethno-nationalistes ont prétendu que les Rohingya seraient bientôt plus nombreux que la majorité bouddhiste. La mission d'enquête des Nations unies a déclaré que « Facebook a été un instrument utile pour les personnes qui désirent propager la haine, dans un contexte où la plupart des utilisateurs, Facebook c'est Internet. »

En Inde, les bandes de lynchage et les autres types de violence collective provenant dans plusieurs cas des rumeurs véhiculées dans les groupes WhatsApp, ont été exacerbées depuis que le parti nationaliste hindou Bharatiya Janata (BJP) a pris le pouvoir en 2014.

De manière similaire, le Sri Lanka a vu les groupes d'auto-défense se baser sur des rumeurs propagées en

ligne pour attaquer la minorité musulmane Tamil. Au cours d'une avalanche de violence en mars 2018, le gouvernement avait, pendant une semaine, coupé l'accès à Facebook et à WhatsApp, ainsi que l'accès à l'application de messagerie Viber en alléguant que Facebook n'avait pas été suffisamment réactive durant la situation d'urgence.

En sensibilisant ses citovens et migrants, les autorités camerounaises ont mis l'emphase sur l'importance de la liberté d'expression et sur la responsabilité que cela implique. Elles ont par ailleurs relevé que le discours haineux n'est pas seulement dangereux pour les individus ou groupes ciblés, mais également pour la Jana ta société en général.

Le Ministre de la communication du Cameroun, Monsieur Emmanuel Sadi a déclaré que : « Vu sur cet angle, il va sans dire que la lutte contre le discours haineux doit être perçue comme une priorité absolue pour la sauvegarde de la démocratie et de l'État de droit et pour préserver les valeurs de la paix et du vivre ensemble. »

Il a continué en ajoutant que : « C'est la raison pour laquelle la Communauté internationale a fait de cela une cause commune et lance un appel pour une mobilisation générale contre le discours haineux à l'échelle mondiale. »

Les effets du discours haineux : Le discours haineux ne cause pas seulement les dommages au niveau personnel, mais peut également inciter à la violence. C'est une attaque contre l'inclusion, la diversité et contre les droits de l'homme. Il met en péril la cohésion sociale et



développement durable et la réalisation des droits de l'homme pour tous.

Les pays de l'Afrique de l'Ouest ont également remarqué que le discours haineux peut prendre plusieurs formes, notamment la communication verbale et écrite, ainsi que les actions et les symboles promouvant la haine et la discrimination, dont ils se sont rendus compte de leur caractère rampant surtout parmi les différentes tribus et communautés du pays.

Dans la même veine, Monsieur Peter Mafany Musonge de la Commission du bilinguisme, a exhorté les camerounais à embrasser le vivre ensemble, tel que prescrit par le Chef de l'État, le Président Paul Biya.

En mai 2019, la Stratégie et le plan d'action des Nations unies sur le discours haineux a été lancée et celleci mettait en évidence le fait qu'il existe un bassin perturbant de xénophobie, de racisme et d'intolérance à travers le monde. On exploite les médias sociaux et d'autres formes de communication comme plateformes pour le fanatisme. Le discours public est utilisé comme une arme à des fins politiques avec des rhétoriques incendiaires qui stigmatisent et déshumanisent les minorités, les migrants, les réfugiés, les femmes ainsi que ceux qu'on appelle les « autres. »

Il s'agit là du fanatisme qui se produit dans toutes les sociétés, que ce soit en ligne ou hors ligne. Parfois, il peut être difficile de déterminer si un commentaire correspond à un discours haineux, surtout lorsque celui-ci est fait dans le monde virtuel. Cela peut être accablant de faire face à des contenus manifestement haineux.

Toutefois, il existe plusieurs manières pour prendre position, même si vous n'êtes pas personnellement la victime d'un discours haineux. Et vous pouvez faire la différence.

Marquez un temps d'arrêt : Abstenez-vous de faire tous commentaires haineux et/ou de partager un tel contenu. Que vous soyez en ligne ou hors ligne, vous devez agir de manière responsable afin d'arrêter la propagation de la haine et de la désinformation. Consultez la campagne des Nations unies « #PledgetoPause » afin de comprendre pourquoi il est



important de prendre un temps d'arrêt avant de partager un contenu en ligne. Apprenez à faire cela de manière responsable - que vous soyez en train de transférer ou de retweeter une story ou en train de regarder une vidéo via votre appareil

Vérifiez les faits : Dans le monde du numérique, il est très courant de tomber sur la désinformation et des contenus dangereux, mais il est très facile de vérifier le contenu que vous avez trouvé est fiable. Pour détecter une fausse information ou une information biaisée, notamment la propagande de discours haineux, assurez-vous de vérifier la source du contenu à l'aide des moteurs de recherche, des outils de vérification des faits et d'autres sources fiables. Vous pouvez également télécharger les images et les faire passer à travers les outils de recherche d'images afin de découvrir là où elles sont apparues pour la première fois.

· Opposez les discours : Une manière de combattre le discours haineux consiste à propager votre propre contre discours afin de vous assurer que la haine ne soit pas l'élément dominant. Vous pouvez également atténuer le contenu haineux en publiant des messages positifs qui prônent la tolérance, l'égalité et la vérité dans la défense des personnes ciblées par le discours haineux.

· Apportez votre soutien : Prendre une position publique pour, et montrer sa solidarité aux personnes victimes de discours haineux démontre que c'est de la responsabilité de tout le monde de rejeter le discours haineux.

Signalez : La plupart des plateformes et communautés en ligne ont des règles pour garder les discussions des utilisateurs respectueuses et elles vous permettront de signaler facilement les messages de haine aux administrateurs ou modérateurs. Lisez les guides et les astuces de la plateforme du média social afin de protéger les utilisateurs du harcèlement et des discours haineux. Pour les cas les plus graves, qui peuvent constituer l'incitation à la violence, au harcèlement et/ou les menaces interdits par la loi, notifiez les organisations en charge de la lutte contre les discours haineux et/ou déposez une plainte à la police (ou chez le Procureur). Certains pays disposent des outils en ligne qui rendent le signalement des discours haineux plus facile.

Éduquez les masses : Vous pouvez aider à sensibiliser contre le discours haineux que ce soit en ligne ou hors ligne en vous engageant simplement dans des conversations avec votre famille et amis concernant les contenus haineux qui peuvent

détruire la société. Préconiser un comportement responsable et partagez des campagnes publiques et des ressources éducatives.

Le Ministre Sadi a pour sa part, souligné les nombreuses mesures que le gouvernement entend prendre pour combattre le discours haineux. Ceci comprend le renforcement des lois et des règlements existants relatifs au discours haineux, l'accroissement de la sensibilisation publique à propos des dangers du discours haineux et la promotion des valeurs positives telles que la tolérance et le respect.

En prenant la parole, le Ministre de l'administration territoriale, Monsieur Paul Atanga Ni a mis l'emphase sur l'importance de tenir les auteurs des discours haineux responsables de leurs actions. Il a également annoncé que le gouvernement prendrait des mesures légales contre les individus et les organisations qui véhiculent les discours haineux.

Le pays francophone a par ailleurs mis en lumière l'important rôle que les médias peuvent jouer dans la lutter contre le discours haineux. Ils ont exhorté les organisations médiatiques à promouvoir un journalisme responsable et d'éviter les histoires à caractère sensationnel qui pourraient attiser les tensions, sous peine de subir les conséquences prévues par la constitution.

OLUREMI TINUBU The Eloquent Nigeria First Lady

n the pulsating heart of Nigerian politics, where the echoes of ambition and the resonance of change collide, Oluremi Tinubu's career illuminates the path for countless others, defying boundaries and shattering barriers in a realm dominated by men. With grace and resilience, she has carved her name into the annals of history as a leader whose journey represents the essence of equality and empowerment in public

service.

Oluremi Tinubu was born on September 21, 1960, in Ogun State, Nigeria. She hails from a humble background and was raised with solid family values. Education was crucial in her household, and she pursued her academic goals with determination. She attended primary and secondary schools in Lagos before proceeding to the University of Ife (now Obafemi Awolowo University) in Osun State, Nigeria.

Following her husband's successful election as Governor of Lagos State in 1999, Oluremi Tinubu became the First Lady of the state. During her time in this role, she focused on several key issues, particularly those affecting women, children, and the less privileged in the society. She initiated and supported various programs aimed at empowering women and improving their access to education, healthcare and economic opportunities.

As the first lady, Oluremi Tinubu founded the New Era Foundation, with the mission to establish centers focusing on the all-round development of the youth and to raise public awareness about environmental health and community service.

Garba.

Senate in 2016, Senator Tinubu raised concerns about her safety and requested adequate security from the Inspector General of Police due to an alleged threat of assault by her colleague and fellow party member, Dino Melaye.

She represented the Lagos Central Senatorial District under the All Progressives Congress (APC) banner, having won re-election in the March 28, 2015 elections, continuing to serve the people of Lagos Central. Again, in the subsequent 2019 general elections, she successfully retained her senatorial seat, marking her third term in office, receiving recognition in the same year at the Eko Excellence Awards, sharing the spotlight with prominent figures like Babajide Sanwo-Olu and Tony Elumelu. 



Nigeria, into Bakinjaw, Messanga Ekol and environs.

As a team player, the Ambassador sponsored a team, comprising the President of Nigerian Union in Ekok, Cameroon, Chief Kalu Itam and the Union's Secretary to Bakinjaw for on the spot assessment of the situation. The team successfully undertook the assignment and confirmed the presence of about 6,811 Nigerian refugees in Bakinjaw, Messanga Ekol and environs.

His Excellency Bappah's formidable team in Buea expeditiously forwarded its report to relevant Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) in Nigeria and

requested immediate relief materials for the displaced Nigerians in Bakinjaw, Messanga Ekol and environs.

As a result, the NEMA dispatched a two-man team, led by its Director of Relief and Rehabilitation to the Consul-General, to reassess the requirements of the Nigerian refugees and to ascertain the best route to deliver the relief materials to them.

To whom much is given, much is expected; Ambassador Bappah ensured that people's will was done. NEMA dispatched three-trailer loads of relief materials from NEMA depot in Jos, Plateau State to Bakinjaw. The relief materials included food items such as thousands of bags of rice, beans, cartons of indomie noodles, sugar, milk, salt and non-food items like floor mats, clothing for women, men and children as well as first aid and basic medications.

Jubilation and celebration erupted in the villages. Kings and leaders were delighted with Bappah's level of capacity. The distribution of the relief materials was a huge success. Majority of the refugees expressed their gratitude for the support received as could be seen in the attached letter addressed to the Consul-General.

The seasoned diplomat took over as Consul-General to the North-west and South-west from Honourable Ibrahim Mohammed Bashir in 2021 after the latter's completion of his three-year tour of duties.

HONOURABLE TAJUDEEN ABBAS

A Speaker with incredible capacity

he emergence of the 10th Speaker, House Representatives , Honourable Tajudeen Abbas followed the pattern of

Senate President, Senator Godswill Akpabio on the same Tuesday, June 13, 2023 the lawmaker representing Zaria Federal Constituency mounted the top seat.

This followed a whirlwind of political spectacle, relentless campaigning, and intense horsetrading. Godswill Akpabio, the "uncommon" former governor of Akwa Ibom state, has ascended to

the throne of the senate president, wielding the gavel, while Tajudeen Abbas, claimed the mantle of leadership in the house of representatives

Akpabio and Abbas were anointed by the All Progressives Congress (APC) as its preferred candidates for the positions. Taking lessons from past experiences, the ruling party took every necessary measure to ensure its nominated candidates are elected.

Abbas was elected in an "openly declare" ballot system, having scored 353 votes out of 359 to defeat fellow contenders, Ahmed Wase and Sani Jaji, who polled three votes each. The ruling All Progressives

Congress (APC) had earlier favoured

and consequently put forward Abbas and Honourable Benjamin Kalu as Speaker and Deputy Speaker. Despite this

decision of the ruling party to present the duo for the position, other contestants, particularly the G-7 group, had vowed to continue in the contest for the speakership seat.

But about three days before the contest, Honourables Muktar Aliyu Betara and Yusuf Adamu Gagdi dropped their ambition, after meeting with President Bola Tinubu and Vice President Kashim Shettima.

Honourables Ahmed Wase and Sani Jaji, however, went on to contest for the position.

The process commenced before 10:00 a.m., as the Deputy Clerk of the National Assembly, Kamoru Ogunlami, alongside the Clerk of the House of Representatives, presided over the session.

Birthed into royalty, Abbas was

born three years after Nigeria gained independence on October 1, 1963, into a ruling family in the Zazzau Emirate nestled in the ancient city of Zaria, Zaria LGA of Kaduna state.

He holds the traditional title of Iyan Zazzau. His great-grandfather was an emir in the Zazzau Emirate. He comes from the Mallawa dynasty of the emirate. Meanwhile, his mother hails from Dutsen Kura in Malumfashi LGA of Katsina state.

By the dictates of the longstanding



tradition, Abbas finds himself within the sacred order of succession. He is in line to ascend the illustrious throne as the Emir of Zazzau. From tender years, little Abbas radiated an aura of exceptional greatness, embodying the rare qualities of a child predestined for

the zenith.

Abbas was enrolled at the LEA Primary School, Lemu, Zaria, where he obtained his first school leaving certificate (FSLC). Continuing in his pursuit of knowledge, he went to the Government Secondary School in Makarfi, where he acquired the West African Examination Certificate

(WAEC) in 1978. With an insatiable hunger for academic excellence, he obtained a Grade I certificate at Kaduna Teacher's College in 1981. Abbas then proceeded to Ahmadu Bello University in Zaria where he studied accounting and bagged a diploma in 1984.

His academic odyssey continued unabated as he obtained a B.Sc in business administration from Ahmadu Bello University in 1988. He bagged an M.Sc in business administration from the same institution in 1993. Abbas went further to get a PhD from Usman Dan Fodio



University in Sokoto.

He also obtained another B.Sc in **Business Administration** Management from Usman Dan Fodio University.

CAREER IN CIVIL SERVICE

Abbas' journey is a captivating tale that saw him blossom from the position of a primary school teacher to an esteemed senior lecturer at the university.

Abbas was a primary school teacher from 1981 to 1988. In June 1998, Abbas decided to temporarily veer away from the familiar path of civil service. He delved into the private sector, joining the Nigerian Tobacco Company (NTC) Plc in Jos. For three years and three months, he held the esteemed position of a general manager, navigating through the complexities of the industry.

> Abbas later joined the Nuhu Bamalli Polytechnic in September 2001, where he lectured until June 2005.

A month after, Abbas embarked on a new chapter at the Kaduna State University. With determination and dedication, he ascended the ranks, reaching the pinnacle of a senior lecturer, a testament to his



profound knowledge and commitment.

Yet, just when his academic career seemed to have reached its zenith, the allure of politics beckoned. In 2010, Abbas made the audacious leap into the unpredictable murky waters of politics, bidding farewell to the halls of academia.

PARLIAMENTARY VOYAGE

Abbas and his colleagues Abbas was first elected to the federal house of representatives on the platform of the now-defunct Congress for Progressive Change (CPČ) in 2011.

In a stunning display of support, he triumphed once again in the 2015 elections, this time on the platform of the All Progressive Congress (APC). Abbas took on multiple roles as a member of various committees within the hallowed green chamber.

He was the deputy chairman of the house committee on legislative compliance between 2011 and 2015. Following the inauguration of the house in 2019, he was appointed to chair the committee on land transport.

Tajudeen was also saddled with other legislative ad hoc assignments in the lower legislative chamber. In 2019, he was appointed as the treasurer of the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association (African chapter).

He was a member of the governing council of the Nigerian Institute of Legislative and Democratic Studies (NILDS) where he represented the north-west geo-political zone from 2019 to 2023.

Abbas was the APC Kaduna caucus leader in the house of representatives, a position he held since 2019. In 2021, he was appointed the chairman of the house of

representatives sub-committee on the constitutional review conference for the north-central.

Despite the numerous roles he handled, Abbas did not take a back seat in delivering his core constitutional mandate of lawmaking. He sponsored several bills and motions. The lawmaker is described by his colleagues as a"silent achiever".

During his four years stint in the 9th lower legislative chamber, he sponsored 74 bills; out of this extraordinary tally, over 18 received presidential assent.

Until recently, many Nigerians were oblivious of his remarkable achievements as Abbas humbly shied away from the limelight.

In recognition of his exceptional legislative achievement, OrderPaper Nigeria, a news media organisation dedicated to reporting parliamentary affairs, recently bestowed upon Abbas an award for being among the top performers in the 9th national assembly.

MAN OF MANY FIRSTS In the course of his career, Abbas has had the golden chance to blaze the trail, sculpting a formidable

bedrock for those after him.

He is the only federal lawmaker from the north-west geo-political zone who has thus far sponsored an unprecedented 74 bills. He is also the first since the return to democracy in 1999 to have sponsored such a number of bills and remains the first to have over 20 signed into law.

Abbas was the pioneer head of the Department of Accounting and Finance, Nuhu Bamalli Polytechnic, Zaria. He also pioneered the Department of Business Administration at the same institution.

The legislator was the pioneer head of the Department of Accounting at Kaduna State University.

Aside from the fact that Abbas was the anointed candidate of the APC, he was also the preferred candidate of Femi Gbajabiamila, his predecessor.

Speaking during an interview, Abbas said the 10th national assembly won't be a rubber stamp under his watch.

With Abbas ascending the throne of the number four seat in the country, all eyes are fixed on him, as he orchestrates the symphony of the green chamber over the course of the next four years.

The non-functioning state of Nigeria's refineries has resulted in a continuous dependence on imported refined petroleum. The importation of fuel puts a strain on the local currency, while the subsidy primarily benefits the political moguls, creating opportunities for arbitrage and illicit transportation of petrol to neighboring countries.

The government faced a challenging dilemma, as it had to choose between continuing the subsidy and exacerbating an unsustainable fiscal deficit or bracing for potential social and economic unrest by removing it. Nevertheless, the subsidy had to be eliminated as decided by the administration. This could result in annual savings of around N7 trillion for Nigeria, which could then be redirected towards vital infrastructure, education and healthcare projects. ٨P

It is no surprise that on 9 July 2023, President Bola Ahmed Tinubu assumed the chairmanship of the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS),

Arincan States (ECOWAS), succeeding President Umaro Sissoco Embaló of Guinea Bissau. achieve greatness. When it comes to grit and tenacity, they are revered for their unwavering spirit and unvielding determination.


Nigerian innovators have carved out a space for themselves on the

How do you fit in family activities given that your career involves travelling a lot?

Having served my beloved country for over 22 years in the Diplomatic Service both in the Ministry and outside Nigeria, my beautiful family has been part of this beautiful journey. My family is always with me as they are used to the type of job I do. They are quite supportivo

As a Queen, has this job given you the opportunity to carry out your royalty preference?

Quite an interesting question. Well, to say that as a Queen and Royalty, that remains in the Palace. As a Diplomat, the job comes first. I have to function as a Públic Servant and there is no way you can combine both functions together.

Knowing that you have a lot of things to accomplish, how do you unwind? I read a lot of great books; I go on

vacations with my family when I am on Home Leave. I swim, I do charity works, watch television, mostly news, movies, I

You have been in Cameroon for two years, tell us how you feel taking a Diplomatic charge in the country? And what are using missing out here? I have been in Douala, the Littoral

Region of the Republic of Cameroon for over two years now. I would say that been the Consul-General of Nigeria to Douala, the Littoral and West Regions of this great country has been both

pleasant and wonderful.

Overseeing the Consulate General of Nigeria here has been great. Ours is mostly based on Consular Matters between our two brotherly countries. Bilateral Issues are also of importance. There are no issues missing out because Nigeria and Cameroon are brothers and we have millions of Nigerians residing in the Littoral and West Regions of this great country. Most of these Nigerians are 3rd and 4th generations of Nigerians that were born in Cameroon. They are both hardworking and law-abiding citizens.

Cameroon is a bilingual country with English and French as its official languages and you are in charge of French-speaking compatriots. How do you intend to interact with your French speaking audiences?

Cameroon is a bilingual country, as you are aware, there are no issues regarding my overseeing of the French-Speaking Regions. Since my arrival, I have been able to express myself in the two official languages, which is a bit of French and English. My interaction with the people in my area of jurisdiction has been perfect and I have been trying to improve in the aspect of the French Language, which is very important. I have previously served in Buenos Aires, Argentina, South America, as Chargé d'Affaire, IA, which is a Spanish country. The whole of South American countries use Spanish or Portuguese as their official channel of Diplomatic communication. It is good to know that most of the Government officials and the citizens of Cameroon that I have interacted with also speak English perfectly.

Nigerians living in Cameroon have boosted the economy with their various business ventures whilst several companies also keep coming from Nigeria to establish in this country. What is your reaction about this and how do you appreciate business climate in Cameroon?

Nigerians living in the Republic of Cameroon are doing exceptionally well in their various areas of businesses. They have boosted the economy of this great country. Nigerians in the Littoral and West Regions are mostly into Small and Medium Businesses; they are mostly into import of spare parts from Nigeria, Electronics, Building Materials, Provision and Cosmetics, Food Stuffs. We also have Nigerian Companies that are domiciled and operating in Douala such as Dangote Cement Cameroon, United Bank for Africa, Air Peace Limited, MRS Corlay, Access Bank Cameroon amongst others. These Companies are in fact headed by both Nigerians and Cameroonians with skills. Cameroon as a country is business friendly with Nigeria based on the numbers of Nigerian Companies that are doing business in Douala and other parts of Cameroon. I often say that Douala is like Lagos of Nigeria and



Johannesburg of the Republic of South Africa because of its Economic potentials.

Permit me to also say that the religious domain is not left out as there are a number of Nigerian churches such as Dunamis International Gospel Centre, the Redeemed Christian Church of God, Winner Chapel International, Deeper Life Bible Church, etc. established in Cameroon. There churches bring Nigerians and Cameroonians together to worship under same roof, while catering for their spiritual needs.

You have been moving around your jurisdiction in Cameroon with progress to encourage and ensure sanity among Nigerians in the host country... How will you describe the attitudes of Nigerians in the country?

My meeting with Relevant Stakeholders in the host country revealed that Nigerians in the Littoral and West Regions are well behaved and are law-abiding and there are no criminal cases recorded against them, if any maybe few. The only problem they have is misunderstanding among themselves and when reported before the Consulate General, it is treated with dispatch. I always appeal to them to be law-abiding to Rules and Regulations of the Host country. On my arrival, I met with the Governor of Littoral Region, H.E. Samuel Dieudonne Ivaha Diboua, the Mayor of Douala City, Dr Roger Mbassa Ndine, as well as other stakeholders in the Region and they all spoke well of Nigerians as serious minded and

business oriented who have been of great economic value to the Republic of Cameroon. Furthermore, my tour of duty to the West Region from 31st May to 3rd June 2022 is another testimony that Nigerians over there are doing well. During my one-one interaction with the Relevant Host Stakeholders, most importantly, the Governor, H.E Awa Fonka Augustine, he applauded and hailed Nigerians in the West Region for the way and manner they

conduct themselves. What should Nigerians in areas of your command be expecting from Your Excellency as regards their welfare and well-being?

Apart from the basic Consular Services which includes issuance of Consular cards, Age Declaration, Emergency Travel Certificate, the Consulate General attends to several Consular issues bordering on child and human trafficking, incessant harassment and detention of Nigerians by Host Security Agents, excessive taxation by host authorities, disputes between and among Nigerians, financial assistance to stranded Nigerians, to mention just a few.

The Consulate also covers the Riverine and Hinterland areas in the Littoral Regions such as Manoka Sub-Division, Toube I and II, Moungangde Village, Tonde Nkam-Yabassi, and Nigerians resident in these areas are mostly Farmers and Fishermen. From time to time, the Consulate General embark on Consular visits in these areas to see how they are faring.

May I also mention that the role of the Consulate General has expanded with the introduction of the E-passport to Nigerian citizens. The Consulate General of Nigeria, Douala, Republic of Cameroon is the only Mission that issues passport in the Central African Region and Nigerians in the Region have been patronizing it.

In fact, the Consulate General is committed to render its normal Consular services as well as promote the economic interests of Nigerians in the Littoral and West Regions. We are also committed to promote trade and investment of Nigerian Companies in Douala, Republic of Cameroon. Having up to seven million Nigerians in Cameroon means the country really has something special to offer. How do you assess the

hospitality of Cameroon?

We have an estimated seven million Nigerians residing in the Republic of Cameroon and out of this seven million, we have five million of them residing in the Littoral and West Regions. The Republic of Cameroon is indeed a beautiful and a great country in the CEMAC Region. Both countries enjoy cordial Diplomatic Relations and we also have great Bilateral Relation. My visits to various government officials in the two Regions have attest to the fact that Nigerians have lived among their Cameroonian brothers for years. They also affirmed that Nigerians are very hardworking and industrious people who contribute to the economy of Cameroon. The Nigerian Community in the Littoral and West Regions have also confirmed to me that they have lived in harmony with their Cameroonian brothers for years. Also, along the line many of these Nigerians have married Cameroonian women and men, which have produced children. To sum it up, I have lived in Douala for over two years and I can say hundred percent to you that the Republic of Cameroon is indeed wonderful in terms of hospitality to us Nigerians and our Nigerian companies. Öther than the Nigerian National Day on 1st October that brings

Nigerians together, could you in your capacity initiate other events that will bring Nigerians together to showcase their culture, food, dances, talents etc.

Douala, Littoral and West Regions of the Republic of Cameroon is home to over 5 million Nigerians. We celebrate our National Day which draws our Nationals from the two Regions that are under my jurisdiction. I receive several invitations from the Nigerian Union and various State Chapters to participate in their activities, these ceremonies bring them closer. These showcase the rich culture and heritage

of our people through food, music, dressing, etc. The Consulate General has participated in the International Women Day Celebrations and I lead the women during the celebrations since I am a female Consul-General. Last year, a fundraising for the New Nigerian Union Secretariat took place. Nigerians in the Littoral Region turned out to support the building of the Secretariat. Bridging the divide

Founder/ Chairman Gtext Holdings

are one of the shots in ligeria's real estate sector and an acclaimed business coach. However, it wasn't a rosy

beginning. How tough was your childhood?

Well about my childhood. I was born in the northern part of Nigeria in Maiduguri. At some point due to our inability to pay house rent, my parents had to move to a village where they bought a land and built one room apartment. The toilet, a pit toilet, was outside and no running water.

Typical rural setting... (laughs) Yes. And we grew in that neighbourhood. In my teen years we moved to the middle part of Nigeria. And it was here I saw people with a more quality lifestyle. And though we moved there we were still the poorest. The passion for wealth and success started. I was able to read a book called "RICH DAD, POOR DAD" between the age of 17 and 18 and that opened my eyes to the possibility of being wealthy. And that wealth has nothing to do with educational background, but has everything to do with your informal knowledge, training and going

1000 naira. What inspired this *journey*?

I didn't have a laptop when we started the bulk SMS business. I didn't even have the account. But I used to do training on business while on campus. And a particular organisation said I should send bulk SMS for their conference. So, they gave me 700 naira, I added 300 naira to it and went to a cyber cafe and created an account under another person. I sent the SMS and that was how I got more clients. And later we owned our own website. A laptop also came and we started doing websites for other people. By 2015 we were the largest in Nigeria because we were operating with multinationals, doing hundreds of millions in the same business. We had to continue this business for about seven years before we saw over 100 million naira in transactions. The place of being consistent is key and we also didn't diversify until the business grew big and we had enough liquidity to start employing more people.

You just spoke about consistency and that brings out the "challenges". The life of an entrepreneur is not easy. What major challenges did you face? (smiles) We are still facing

challenges. Challenges are the



through apprenticeship. This was the game changer. I started business as a teenager but it was formally registered 15 years ago. We started as a digital marketing firm doing bulk SMS, E-mail and social media marketing. Eight years ago we expanded into real estate and today we are in four continents of the world.

You have a very inspiring status, starting a business with

fruit of champions. And the mindset of entrepreneurs is always to overcome obstacles and challenges. And I faced so many. My mother died in the early days of my

entrepreneurship. Many of the businesses failed. I failed in almost 20 businesses. Most of the time we hear only of the successful ones. I even thought it was spiritual because I kept



starting businesses and failing. But today I know better that I didn't have a mentor in my early days and I couldn't even afford the available ones. I kept doing trial and error and that was why those businesses were failing. I have been through hell being an entrepreneur. I have had seasons where my son couldn't go to school because I had a choice to either pay salaries or his school fees. If I don't pay the salary the business is going to be over.

Of course...

DR AKINTAYO: So, I had to pay my workers, while my son stayed back at home. I can go on and on. Yes, the challenges were many. But I didn't have an.. There was just no other option. I tried getting a job. I sent 100 CVs. I even told employers not to pay me for six months. But I did not still have a job. So, I didn't really have a choice than to make sure this business I have must work.

What really kept you going in the midst of the storm?

Honestly it was the fact that I didn't have a choice. Some people have options and here in Africa you could rely on your cousin or uncle. But in my case my mother was the breadwinner because my father's business had collapsed and he was not able to raise us financially. She died of

ovarian cancer about 12 years ago. So, I didn't have who to go to. There was no rich uncle that you could just talk to and he will help you. There was a day after my mom died that we spent over two days with no food and my brother had his pregnant wife. An idea popped in his mind. One of his friends sell vegetables. So, my brother a graduate decided to take

vegetables from him and distribute to restaurants of companies around the town dressed in suit. Then he will pay back later. Imagine a young graduate selling vegetables dressed in suits. He put them in this "Ghana must go[†] bags and took them to these restaurants. Though these restaurants had their clients they decided to receive supplies from him due to his dressing in suit. For me I had to go from door to door asking people to buy my bulk SMS by signing up for an account with just 500 naira. We didn't really have a choice. If I had a choice I would have given up.

Eight years later you went into real estate with Gtext Holdings. But let's look at the sector in general. Nigeria is a fertile ground for Real Estate. What factors do you think have caused this boom in the Nigerian Real Estate? Investment, Demand or both?

Demand is key here. Nigeria is a big country and the next census may give us a population of 300 million people. By size we are not that big because of our small land size. This has put pressure on the demand for Real Estate. More people want houses. The housing deficit of Nigeria is over 20 million. This is a serious problem. But the Nigerians in the diaspora have also been major investors. Because many of them have not had it easy with the mortgage system in the United States and other parts of the world. Sometimes the banks there even sell vour house below the market price if you can't pay. Imagine you working for 10 years and all that effort gone. So many Nigerians abroad think that no matter what happens they need to have something back at home. Any emergency can happen I will have to go back to Nigeria. And this has helped the sector in a great way.

At what point did you realise that Real Estate was the

master key? DR AKINTAYO: It was when I visited Silicon Valley eight years ago. I went to Silicon Valley, Google campus, Facebook campus, LinkedIn and Apple campus. I was shocked to see that Google campus was bigger than the biggest university I knew in Nigeria. I thought these tech companies will focus on office work. But for them to have massive real estate, it was amazing. I kept crossing Express ways. But I was within Facebook campus. It therefore dawned on me that these are

not just Tech companies. They were major Real estate investments. For example, different cities were bidding to host Amazon's second campus promising tax breaks and other incentives work billions of dollars. C.E.O once said, "We are not a burger company. We are a Real Estate company." Because he makes more money from Real Estates than selling burger. So, I realised that Real Estate was the backbone of any economy activity. And until we realise this, we are not going to make any headway.

What policies have the Federal Government put in place to ensure that this sector is viable?

DR AKINTAYO: In Nigeria we don't have enough positive policies yet and it's across Africa. This is because the political leaders do not know that it's also in their own interest to have the right policies in place. When you look at the growth of any successful nation, Real Estate has been the backbone. America for example has the largest Real Estate market with over \$30 trillion. Dubai is what it is today not because of oil but on the backdrop of Real Estate. They are even bracing up to

build the largest airport in the world that will take about 230 million people every year. And African nation that wants to become great must do same through Real Estate because it is the only asset that is Real. That's why it is called Real Estate because it is tangible. You can't touch FOREX or crypto. But you can touch Real Estate and that's the beauty about it. So, government has a duty to do, starting with good policies. Ancestral families own land. So, coming up with a policy that government is the new owner of land is an issue that needs to be look into. If I were in such position, the first thing I will do is remove the law. I'd rather let there be a tax on every land. It's not okay that government is the owner of the land and still collects usage tax. This is multiple taxation. We hope to see these laws evolve in Africa.

For starters going into Real Estate, what should they bear in mind?

They first need to know that Real Estate is a long-term game, not a short-term game. People come into the sector, take too much loan over leverage and they crash. ND: Talking about finance,




how friendly are Nigerian banks to Real Estate operators?

DR AKINTAYO: They are not friendly at all (laughs). Right now, I am thinking of starting a mortgage bank and a commercial bank in the future. These banks leave too much money on the table. Many banks in the West have developed by leveraging Real Estate. The 2008 crisis was caused by the collapse of a Real Estate bank. Our banks are scared of giving out loans and mortgages. And I think it starts with the Central Bank. The Central Bank has to come up with a policy that makes it a guarantee for Real Estate loans. The commercial banks can be powered too. Mortgage banks with resources to handle this situation are not enough. You can empower commercial banks. If someone takes a loan and can't pay, you can sell the property at auction and take back your money or sell it to another institution that the bank may set up. The banking sector must unlock the potential of Real Estate in Africa. In 15 years we (Gtext Homes) have not taken a single bank loan. Not because we don't want to. But the terms are not favourable. If you go for loan, it's almost as if you are selling out your business. The terms alone make you not to pay back. We are leveraging on social capital. We rely on individuals who know and believe in our story. They invest with us and receive returns. This has proven to be better than going to the commercial bank for loans which is unfortunate.

ND: African countries have depended on their natural resources to power their economies since Independence Oil, Gas, Minerals, Timber and Agriculture. For a country like Nigeria dependent on oil and the call by the government for economic diversification. Do you think Real Estate can be master key to economic boom?

We just need to check other





cultures and see how they have developed. In Saudi Arabia, Neon is evolving to become a major diversification strategy for the country. In the U.A.E, Dubai has evolved and makes more money leveraging on Real Estate. All the major cities of the world have evolved on the Real Estate sector. Even Silicon Valley is hinging on Real Estate of Tech. Globally these cities make money and sustain their economy through Real Estate. With renewable energy oil will soon dry up. So, it's no longer sustainable. We are talking about renewable and Green energy So, you can't count on consistent reliance on natural resources. It's time to develop Real Estate. Douala for example has beautiful waters. Some chemicals can be put into most of this swampy water to become beautiful. This has been done in Las Vegas. Private individuals must step up. And government must create that enabling environment. I have seen beautiful plantations coming down to Douala. If you could work on the waterways and make it cleaner, you will love this city

Tell us about Gtext Homes, the subsidiary specialised in Real Estates...

Gtext Homes is divided into three units. We have the housing section

(Gtext Homes), the land section (Gtext Lands) and the secondary market Gtext suite for finished houses. We now operate in Dubai operating over 100 houses. There is massive expansion in the U.S. We have decided not just to grow locally. We also needed to go internationally. This is because we cannot raise all the money locally to build what we intend to build. Our vision is to build 25,000 smart homes with Gold club, beaches and other tourist resorts. 200 of that will be done across Africa. And we need over \$20 billion in the next 12 years to accomplish that. We can raise this amount locally. When you expand internationally, your works speak for you. And we can tell our partners to invest back at home. Based on what you have done in Dubai, U.S and the U.K for example we can trust you for Nigeria. We will be investing heavily internationally in the next five years so that we can have the backbone to push those investors to come to Africa.

ND: What makes Gtext different from other Real Estate agencies?


DR AKINTAYO: We are the first to start the concept to Green and smart homes in Africa. We also believe in giving back. We had to do the road leading to most of our Estates with our own money. We put in 50 million naira to do 400km of roads. There are also lots of futuristic action concepts around our projects. We target Touristic and Residential aspects in our estates and we hope to maintain that.

You are piloting this initiative known as "Smart City Initiative". What is it all about?

It is all about making everything smart. You can control your home even when you are away from home. The Green part of it is about Renewable Energy, not just grass. We are not going to be connecting our Estates with national grid. We are going to be generating our own electricity. We know that internationally these innovation change. In Dubai the city is already Smart and the energy from the Government. But what we are going to do is brand our units with celebrities. We are having concepts like Ighalo Residence, Davido Residence and other celebrities. We are already talking with some of them. If they agree, they will work with our architect and design the interior according to their taste. And the day the owner is taking the keys of his/her house, the celebrity will hand over the keys.

Away from entrepreneurship, let's talk mentorship. You have mentored over 15,000 Nigerians and others across Africa. What drives you in this endeavour?

Well, my vision is to raise 1 million millionaires across Africa before I leave this earth. One of the reasons is because I lacked a mentor when I was starting. When you look at why the private sector continued to grow, it's not just because politicians are incompetent. It's largely because we don't have enough entrepreneurs. Global economies are not driven by government. Jobs are not created by the government. The private sector creates the jobs. So, if you don't unleash the potential of the private sector, Africa will continue to struggle. But if the private sector is allowed to grow, Africa will be more prosperous: an Africa where people have jobs, are self-sufficient and have a great life for themselves. I think that Africans are resilient, they are strong. Just give them an enabling



environment, and they will figure things out. Africans are not asking too much. Give us electricity, good internet and make the law easy and friendly, an idea will blossom. I was shocked to see people here in Cameroon with their Real Estate and they tell me "I learned everything from you through your books." I have seen people having AirBnB and they acknowledge they learn the whole concept from me. This is same in Ghana and other areas I have visited. This means that show an African, give him hope, show him the way, create the environment and he or she will fly.

You are the founder of the Stephen Akintayo Foundation. What provoked you to come up with the foundation and what activities have been executed so far?

We realised that a lot of entrepreneurs lack access to other successful entrepreneurs with whom they can scale their businesses. For me it was difficult to meet people who could help me at my level. Those whom I could meet did not do businesses as big as mine. So, they could really tell me that at this level, this is what I have to do. So, I said to myself that we must create and enabling environment, not only to give money. But to enable starters, watch how you run an empire that is bigger than theirs. We began by giving grants of \$5million, that is \$5000 dollars to 1000 entrepreneurs. We took from the Tony Elumelu Foundation and we added more mentorship. These entrepreneurs join my C.E.O Entrepreneurship programme and they are in the same groups with my own mentor C.E.Os. They see us make decisions; I share

my challenges with them. By the time their business gets to my level, they already know what to do. This is helping them to scale. The entrepreneurs also network with each other and see how they can do business amongst themselves. They also have exposure because I promote their businesses on my platform. I travel with them and give them visibility. This year we are focusing on Nigeria because charity begins at home (laughs). From next year we will expand to other African countries. So, Cameroonians, Ghanaians, Kenyans and other African countries can apply. We will also open up to Africans in the diaspora because we also need to empower them. If they grow strongly, they too will empower their brothers here on the continent. The system in the West favours entrepreneurs because it is capitalist. What does it take for someone to be

What does if take for someone to be part of the initiative?

They just need to go to stephenakintayofoundation.org and apply. Every month there's a different category. So, they check which category is in line with their business and they apply. They can do so months ahead. I am not involved. There's a team who select the top 50 ideas and scrutinise them. The last 10 applicants will pitch their ideas on Instagram LIVE. And an independent judge will pick those to benefit from the grant. This year we are doing 24, next year we are increasing to over 70. So about 10 people will be awarded the grant every month.

How will the funds for the 5 million for 5 years be raised and how will it be distributed over the five years? At the moment Gtext Homes and

25000 Green Expert Home Project are the one sponsoring. However, we are registered in the United States as a Non-profit organisation. This registration is such that people can write off their tax by donating to the foundation. So, we are hoping that from next year we will do a lot of work in the US. And we are expecting donors from the western world. And we will push some campaigns about the foundation and what we do. But this year, we are in charge because my principle is to first use your own funds if you really believe in it and let people see that you are doing it and it's genuine before calling on others to ioin.

How viable is mentorship for the growth of entrepreneurship in Nigeria and Africa?

It's very viable because it gives room for many donors to give funds to help entrepreneurs. There are many donors. But they need genuine programs to support. Donors don't work with NGOs because there is a possibility of fraud. So, they work with established programmes. For example, it is easy to trace the Bill Gates Foundation because it is credible. There's a shift in how philanthropy works.

You have been vetted into the Forbes Business Council. How has this recognition added value to your entrepreneurial journey?

This is a club of people whose businesses is over \$1million and above. It gives opportunities to network with other entrepreneurs. It also gives me the chance to write. I have an article every month on Forbes Magazine that teaches and shares value on Entrepreneurship.

he shocking reveal of the Black Entertainment Television Awards, popularly known as the BÉT awards, for the category of Viewers' Choice Best

International New Act award, has continuously made a loud buzz all over the internet.

In the blink of an eye, one could easily pick out the possible winner of the BET Viewers' Choice Best International New Act award as the nominees list contained some of the currently most global trending artists, Including, Werenoi, Camidoh, Pabi Cooper, Libianca, Raye, Flo, MC Ryan and Nigerian's great singer and songwriter, Ahmed Ololade, popularly called Asake who has been topping national and international musical charts in recent times, from one hit song to another, months after months. Many would agree that his nomination for the BET awards was a great stepping stone in his music career as his global recognition journey only just started about eight months ago after the release of his debut album Mr. Money With The Vibe in 2022 which made groundbreaking records across the world, So as much as his fans didn't see his nomination coming, it also

Libianca delivered the trending song "People" (check on me), a masterpiece which triumphed over Asake (Mr. Money), Werenoi, Camidoh, Pabi Cooper, Raye, Flo, MC Ryan at the BET 2023 for the category of "Viewers' Choice Best International New Act awards". This announcement posed to be

one of the most engaging news in the



history of BET awards as it has had millions of entertainment fans screaming in disbelief, some in excitement, and others in a state of dilemma, considering if it was an unfair or well-deserved win.

The Cameroonian-American Afrobeats singer, Libianca, has been in the music industry as a singer and songwriter since as far as 2021, when she was spotted as a contestant on the twenty-first season of NBC's The Voice with Blake Shelton as her coach who she had chosen over John Legend, Kelly Clarkson and Ariana Grande.

She recently gained a wider range of international recognition after the release of her debut single "People' which is said to have been inspired by cyclothymia and gave her the career breakthrough she needed as it made its way up to No. 1 in the UK Afrobeats chart, No. 2 on the US Billboard Afrobeat chart, No. 2 in UK Official chart and top chart on many other recognized platforms. Let us not forget its notorious buzz on

TikTok and every other social media platform you can think of and now won its way up to BET Viewers' Choice Best International New Act awards.

Libianca, became the first-ever Cameroon music artist to get nominated for a BET award and the first Cameroonian music artist to win a BET Viewers' Choice Best International New Act award. This takes the Cameroon music industry to a whole new level of global recognition in world music and entertainment industry. It's safe to say that Libianca is a force that is currently driving the Cameroonian music industry to the spotlight among other artists.

According to BBC, Libianca wrote the song in November last year, after she had thrown a Thanksgiving party where she "felt invisible' "I'd been at a low point of my life

She also told Brooke Bailey during an interview that the inspiration for her song "People" had come from a place of depression as she explained her journey to achieving a

eroundbreaking song. - "The inspiration came from my depression. What I was going through at the time was, you know, it was just a very low, low moment. I wasn't feeling, you know, inspired to do anything really. Just wanted to stay in bed, cry my eyes out, shut the world out, isolate, I knew that writing or just going into this studio would make me feel better. The night after I posted the song on TikTok. I woke up, my manager, he's my best friend too, but Metro wakes me up in the morning and he's like, "You have to see this. You have to see this man. You have to see." I'm like, "What's going on?" I'm not a morning person, wake up and we see videos being done to the sound already and it's already at 80K "Ah, wow." it's like plus 10,000 followers, you refresh it plus another 10K is like, "Okay." And I just froze. I mean, I didn't know what to do.'


Which artist would you be interested in collaborating with in 2023?

1 Statility of

The Creation of accompany in Cameroon is done at the CENTER FOR BUSINESS CREATION FORMALITIES (CFCE), which is represented in all regions of Cameroon.

APPLICABLE LAW FOR THE **REGISTRATION OF BUSINESSES**

The applicable law is the OHADA Law on Commercial Companies and Economic Interest Groups.

1. FORMS OF BUSINESSES PROVIDED BY OHADA LAW

According to Article 3 of the Uniform Act relating to Commercial Companies and Economic Interest Groups in Cameroon, any person, (national or non-national,

individual or legal person) wishing to engage in a commercial activity shall choose a form of company that suits the activity envisaged from among those provided by the OHADA (Organization for the Harmonization of Business Law in Africa) Law. The forms of businesses are:

- Private Company
- Private Limited Company
- Public Limited Company
- Simplified Joint Stock Company
- Limited Partnership Economic Interest Group

1.1. PRIVATE LIMITED COMPANY (LTD) (SARL)

A Private Limited Liability company is a form of company where the shareholder(s) have limited liability. Shares in a Private Limited liability company shall be personal property and shall not be open to the public.Article 309 of the Uniform Act relating to Commercial Companies and Economic Interest Groups of the OHADA Law stipulates that a private limited liability company may be formed by a natural person or a corporate body, or by two or more natural persons or corporate bodies. Thus a Private Limited Company can be created by a sole shareholder.

A foreigner can equally register a Private Limited Company in Cameroon, however, where a foreigner holds more than 50% of the total share capital he will have to obtain authorization from the minister of commerce before carrying out commercial

activities in Cameroon.

The law of December 14, 2016, to fix the minimum registered capital and conditions for using notary publics in the establishment of private limited companies in Cameroon, reduced the minimum share capital of a private limited company from One Million(1 000 000)Franc CFA to One Hundred thousand (100.000)FRANC CFA.

Shares can be in kind or in cash i.e. shareholders may contribute to the company in the form of money, services(supply of labor), rights on movable or immovable, tangible or intangible(an idea or intellectual property). Contributions in cash must be fully paid up at the time of the formation of the company. The administration and management of a Private Limited company is simple, one or more managers can manage a Private Limited Company. A shareholder can be appointed as the manager of a Private Limited company. Manager(s) can be appointed in the Articles of Association, or subsequently at an Ordinary Meeting.

The appointment of an auditor is not mandatory; however, the appointment of one or more auditor(s) becomes mandatory where the company fulfilled at the close of a fiscal year either two of the following; Ø The balance sheet is greater than one hundred and twenty-five million (125.000.000) FRANC CFA; The annual turnover exceeds Ø

Two hundred and Twenty Five Million

(250 000 000) Franc CFA; Ø The permanent Staff exceeds 50

persons;

Auditors are elected in the ordinary general meeting of the company at the close of the fiscal year.

A Private Limited Company is set up for a period of ninety-nine(99) years, the existence of the company begins on the date it is entered in the Trade and Personal Property Credit Register of the city/town where the desired head office of the Company shall be located. The expiry of the term of the company shall entail its automatic dissolution unless an extension of its life span has been decided upon under the conditions laid down in Articles 32 to 36 of the OHADA Uniform Act. The registration of a Private Limited Company can be done within 7-30 working days.

1.2. PUBLIC LIMITED COMPANY (PLC)(S.A)

A Public Limited Company can offer shares to the Public, the minimum share capital of a Public Limited Company is Ten Million(10 000 000) Franc CFA. A single shareholder can register a Public Limited Company. A foreigner can register a Public Limited Company. However, certain sectors of activities require a local shareholder to hold shares. The share capital of the Public Limited Company must be fully subscribed for before the date of the signature of the Articles of Association. 25% of the share capital representing cash contributions must be paid upon incorporation and the rest is payable within three years from the date of registration of the company in the Trade and Personal Property Credit Registry. Shares can be in kind or in cash i.e. shareholders may contribute to the company in the form of money, services(supply of labor), rights on movable or immovable, tangible or intangible(an idea or intellectual property). Contributions in cash must be fully paid up at the time of the formation of the company.

The administration and Management of a public Limited company are determined by the Articles of Association at incorporation or by the constituent general meeting. The forms include:

Ø A public limited Company with a managing director;

A Public Limited Company with Ø a Board of Directors.

The Public Limited Company may be managed and directed by a managing director if the number of shareholders is equal to or less than three(03). The Public Limited Company with boards of directors comprises of:

Ø An administrative Board, the Board of Directors

Ø The general management is assumed by a natural person, in this case, the general manager (or chairman and general manager in the event of the same person holding the functions of chairman

of the board of directors and general manager)

In a Public Limited company with a managing director, the Managing director assumes both the functions of a director and general management of the company. The Public Limited Company shall be administered by a board of directors when the number of shareholders exceeds three (03). The directors may be either shareholders or non-shareholders. Where the articles of association are silence the appointment of non-shareholder directors shall be the responsibility of the ordinary general meeting.

The appointment of auditors is optional where the company does not make a public call for capital but mandatory where it makes a Public call for capital. The time frame for the registration of a Public Limited Company is two (02) weeks. 1.3. SIMPLIFIED IOINT STOCK COMPANY (SAS)

This form of company is recommended for tech startups, it is prescribed in Article 853-3 of the Uniform Act Relating to Commercial Companies and Economic Interest Groups. The simplified joint stock company (SAS) offers a high degree of operational flexibility. Simplified Joint Stock companies with a sole shareholder whether a natural person or a legal entity are known as Sole shareholder simplified joint stock companies in French Société par actions simplifiée unipersonnelle (SASU). In a Simplified Joint Stock Company, the founding partners are free to determine the share capital and the rules for organizing the company in the Articles of Association. Contributions may be in cash or in kind. At least half of the cash contribution must be paid upon incorporation and the remainder within 5 years.

A chairman however should be chosen to represent the SAS in dealings with third parties.

The appointment of a statutory auditor is not mandatory in SASs, except in special

cases. Dematerialization of assets is now compulsory for Simplified Joint Stock

Companies. It is worth noting that there are three mandatory stages/steps involved in the incorporation of a company in Cameroon. These stages are pre-incorporation, Incorporation and post-incorporation. Pre – Incorporation

This stage requires the Residence Certificate. Certificate of Non Conviction Attestation of bank account to

shareholders or promoters, those intending to incorporate or form a company to furnish the Notary Public with some personal documents. These documents are Certified copy or copies of National Identity Card or Passport for foreigners ensure funds derived for incorporation, share capital- shall be immediately deposited in any commercial bank in the

name of the company being formed against a receipt or funds derived for incorporation shall be immediately deposited in the Notary chambers against a receipt as well as provided for by Article 313 of the Uniform Act of OHADA. Article 313

Funds derived from the payment for shares shall be immediately deposited by the founder, against a receipt, in a bank account opened in the name of the company being formed or in a Notary's office".

Copy of minutes by shareholder or promoters intending to Incorporate or form the company. The minute clearly states the form of the company to be incorporated.

The above mentioned documents are deposited before the Notary's Office. Incorporation After these documents have been lodged with the Notary Public the notary now proceeds to set the incorporation in motion. The notary public drafts the standard copies of Articles of Association in the form of Notarial Deed as provided by section 10 of the Uniform Act of OHADA. All the shareholders are required to sign the Articles of Association. The originals of the Articles are deposited at the Notary Chambers. They can only be amended by the same procedure. The Notary submits all the company documents at the front desk of the CENTRE DE FORMALITIES D'ENTREPRISES. The staff registers the company with the TRADE AND PERSONAL CREDIT REGISTER, the tax administrator and the CNPS. The Following Documents are filed with the Registration of companies at the registry of the court of First Instance of the Jurisdiction of incorporation. These documents are:

Copies Articles of Association Location Plan of the Business Premise

Criminal record of the Director of the company or sworn declaration

Certificate of Non conviction (not less than 3 months)

Declaration of Regularity and conformity, drawn up by the Notary Public and signed by the share Holders or a Notary Statement of subscription and payment in lieu thereof.

Stamp duty tenancy agreement of the proposed business premises of the Company

NB: with the recent Finance Law, each page of the Articles of Association bears a Fiscal Stamp of 1500 FRS, the entire Articles are Stamp Duty and registered with the Tax Department.

POST INCORPORATION

After depositing the documents at the Registrar of companies, a Certificate of incorporation is issued, giving the Company the Legal Personality .The Newly Incorporated Company is published in any legal Journal.

My counsel is to approach new countries, including Nigeria, with humility. Not implying my compatriots lack this trait, I believe humility paves the way for others to seek you out, guiding you to your rightful place. Had I

Impacts Cameroonians With Billionaire Habits







The Inspiring of 13 Lives Regaining Freedom and Embracing Hope

Beams of hope break through the darkness as thirteen prisoners step into a newfound freedom. In a heartwarming alliance, Ambassador Lawal Bappah, Nigeria's Consul General for the North West and South West Regions of Cameroon, alongside the illustrious HRM Chief Jonathan Thomas Eze Gburu Gburu, orchestrated the liberation of thirteen Nigerian inmates from the confines of Buea Central Prison in the Southwest Region of Cameroon. The date that marked this remarkable turnaround was Thursday, July 27th, 2023.

Chief Eze Gburu Gburu, an influential figure known for his philanthropy and business acumen, stands as a beacon of support for his fellow Nigerians in Cameroon.

Ambassador Lawal Bappah took the stage to share the good news that travel documents and transport fares were prepared for the returning Nigerian nationals.
